AUTHORITY:	42 USC 13041 and USC 3013.
PRINCIPAL PURPOSE:	To comply with requirements of Public Law 101-647, Section 231 (Crime Control Act of 1990).
ROUTINE USES	To initiate the background check requirements of the statute.
DISCLOSURE:	Mandatory. Failure to disclose the information precludes consideration of an application for employment in a child care worker position or may form the basis for removal from a child care worker position if you are a current incumbent of a child care worker position.

FOR INDIVIDUALS IN STUDENT/VOLUNTEER CHILD CARE POSITIONS**

I, _____, understand that I have been placed in a position of student / volunteer, which requires the completion of Criminal History Background Checks. I understand these checks are in accordance with the Crime Control Act of 1990 and North Atlantic Regional Medical Command (NARMC) Policy Memorandum #08-20 and agree to the following conditions:

- I understand and agree to the requirement of Line-of-Sight Supervision (LOSS). Line-of-Sight Supervision is a requirement until the background checks have been submitted to states where I have resided in the past five (5) years and favorable results are obtained from those checks.
- I understand that the requirement for criminal history background checks is a condition of my student/volunteer status at Womack Army Medical Center. I understand that I may be removed from this program if unfavorable results are obtained from the state criminal history repository/background investigation.
- I understand that I must comply with the requests for information required by the Crime Control Act of 1990 and understand that failure to comply will result in my removal from this position.
