

SCOPE OF PRACTICE GUIDELINES

OCCUPATIONAL THERAPY LAST UPDATED 22 JULY 2010

MEDICAL (M-S), OCCUPATIONAL THERAPY (OT-S) AND PHYSICIAN ASSISTANT STUDENTS (PA-S)

1. Rotating interns, residents, and students and physician's assistant students will be introduced to the Occupational Health Program through discussions, lectures, and other methods to become familiar with the following elements:

- a. Job-related medical surveillance.
 - b. Administrative medical examinations.
 - c. Employee education about job-related health hazards.
 - d. Hearing conservation.
 - e. Occupational vision.
 - f. Pregnancy surveillance.
 - g. Job-related immunizations.
 - h. Illness absence monitoring.
 - i. Chronic disease surveillance.
 - j. Epidemiologic investigations of occupational injury/illness.
 - k. Industrial hygiene surveys and safety and health inspections.
 - l. Work site visits program.

2. Rotating Family Medicine residents/interns, medical students and physician's assistant students will be required to evaluate patients as this rotation is intended only as an introduction to the use of Occupational Therapy Services as an adjunct to overall patient health care and referral.
